
A Bold Tribute to Malaysia's Tin Mining Legacy

As you enter the main doors, a steel sculpture greets you, symbolising the weaving, intricate structure of the Tin Mining Dredge—a tribute to an industry that shaped Kuala Lumpur.

KL's origins date back to 1857, when tin mining along the Gombak and Klang rivers transformed the muddy confluence into a thriving city. The striking feature wall at Level G celebrates this legacy—showcasing old machinery, a tin mining wheel carved into the reception, and industrial-inspired brick and metal accents. The sculpture's mirror reflection adds depth, highlighting the industrial spirit that defined Malaysia's rise as a top tin producer.

This design sets the tone, blending history with an industrial aesthetic that invites exploration and wonder.

To delve deeper into this fascinating heritage, guests can also visit the Royal Selangor Visitor Centre, where the story of tin mining continues through immersive exhibits and hands-on experiences.

To dive deeper into this heritage, plan a visit to Tanjung Tualang Tin Dredge No. 5—Malaysia's last and only remaining tin dredge. Step inside this colossal structure to experience firsthand the engineering marvels and stories behind the nation's tin mining era.

Our outdoor spiral staircase, inspired by the tin mining era, connects Level 19 to Level 21 and offers stunning views of Kuala Lumpur's skyline. Painted in the vibrant colours of the Malaysian flag—red, white, yellow, and blue—it's a striking symbol of history and national pride.

Drawing inspiration from the spiral staircases of KL's historic shophouses, this design invites savvy explorers to journey through time, from the past to the present. Strategically placed "windows" at landings frame views of the Petronas Twin Towers and KL's lush greenery, blending urban beauty with industrial heritage.

The staircase's vintage industrial palette echoes the last remaining tin dredge in Malaysia, creating a colorful, cultural experience that celebrates Malaysia's rich history. As you ascend, enjoy a captivating, panoramic view, and once at the top, take a moment to feel on top of the world — walking above the city streets below.

追溯采矿历史

向马来西亚锡矿历史致敬的大胆设计

步入酒店主入口，迎面而来的是一座钢铁雕塑，其交织而复杂的结构灵感源自锡矿采矿铁船 (Tin Mining Dredge)，象征着塑造吉隆坡发展的重要产业。

吉隆坡的起源可追溯至1857年，当年在鹅唛河与巴生河一带的锡矿开采，将原本泥泞的河口逐渐发展为繁荣的城市。位于 G 层的标志性主题墙正是对这段历史的致敬，展示了旧时代的采矿机械元素，将锡矿轮巧妙地融入接待柜台设计，并以工业风格的砖材与金属细节强化整体氛围。雕塑的镜面反射进一步拉伸空间层次，凸显马来西亚作为世界主要锡矿生产国之一的工业精神。

整体设计以历史为根基，结合鲜明的工业美学，为宾客营造出探索与发现的氛围。

若想进一步了解这段引人入胜的历史，宾客亦可前往皇家雪兰莪·当代锡镴馆 (Royal Selangor Visitor Centre)，透过沉浸式展览与互动体验，深入认识马来西亚的锡矿故事。



转动历史的齿轮

在接待处，屹立着象征马来西亚锡矿辉煌时代的巨大“采锡轮”，它述说着一个关于雄心、坚韧与创新的故事。这座“采锡轮”位于酒店G层，是当年国家锡矿业蓬勃发展的关键工具。凭借水力或机械动力驱动，这些巨大的轮盘通过重力分离锡矿石与杂质，在采矿过程中发挥了至关重要的作用，成就了马来西亚作为世界顶级锡矿生产国之一的历史地位。尽管现代科技早已取代了传统设备，但“采锡轮”仍是国家丰富矿业遗产的象征，见证着那段光辉岁月。

在十九世纪中叶，锡矿业的兴起吸引了大批来自中国南方的移民——他们大多来自广东与福建，带着采矿的经验与不屈的精神，远渡南洋来到马来西亚。华人矿工组成“公司”合作开采矿区，辛勤劳作，为吉隆坡与霹雳、雪兰莪等地的繁荣奠定了基础。像叶亚来等华人领袖，不仅推动了锡矿业的发展，也在吉隆坡重建与城市治理中扮演了重要角色。正是这些早期华人的智慧与毅力，让这座城市从泥泞的矿村成长为充满活力的首都。

若想更深入了解这段历史，不妨造访位于霹雳州的登珠安采锡铁船五号 (Tanjung Tualang Tin Dredge No.5) ——马来西亚现今唯一保存下来的采锡船。走进这座庞然大物，亲身感受当年的工程奇迹与那段辉煌的采锡岁月。





标志性螺旋楼梯背后的故事

酒店的户外螺旋楼梯灵感源自锡矿开采年代，连接19楼与21楼，并可俯瞰吉隆坡迷人的城市天际线。楼梯以马来西亚国旗的红、白、黄、蓝为主色，既醒目又富有象征意义，体现历史传承与国家认同。

设计亦参考了吉隆坡老街屋常见的螺旋楼梯元素，引领探索者穿梭于过去与当下。各层平台巧妙设置了“窗口”，将国油双峰塔与城市绿意框景呈现，在都市景观与工业遗产之间取得平衡。

整体配色延续复古工业风格，呼应马来西亚现存的最后一艘锡矿采矿铁船，为空间注入鲜明的文化层次。拾级而上，城市全景逐步展开；抵达顶端时，仿佛行走在城市之上，感受独特而开阔的视野体验。
