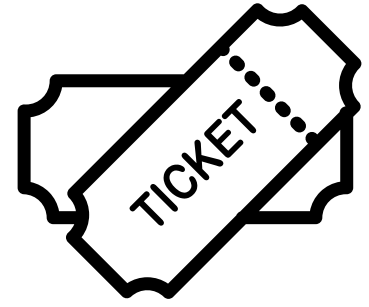


WATER BUSES IN MURANO

This section is an overview of the water bus routes to/from Murano Island. For any questions reach out to the Front Desk team.

- **Bear in mind that from Venice main island "Fondamente Nove" stop, public transportation is available 24/7** - [click here](#) to see the location on Google Maps. From this stop take lines #4.1 / 4.2 or NMU that depart all day and all night long from the pier "B". Frequency is every 10 mins during the day, 20 mins from 9 pm to 11 pm and 30 mins in the night. The stop of the hotel is "Murano Museo"
- **#4.1 / 4.2:** these are circular lines which operate starting from the early morning until dinner time. Both stop at "Fondamente Nove" and Murano Island with more than two dozen stops along the way including, among others, the St. Mark's Square. For your convenience, from the St.Mark's Square the quickest line back to the hotel is the #4.1. If departing from the hotel, the quickest is the #4.2. Keep in mind that the last waterbus #4.1 from the St.Mark's Square is at 8:01 pm. After that time, walk back to "Fondamente Nove" stop pier "B" to board the vaporetto back to "Murano Museo"
- **Route NMU:** this acronym stands for "Night Line Murano Island". This line goes from Murano Island to the main Island of Venice-"Fondamente Nove" stop
- **Route 3:** a semi-express line which connects the Island of Murano, the railway station S.Lucia and the car and bus terminal of Piazzale Roma. The quickest route during the day
- **Route 12:** the boat to take to visit Burano and Torcello Islands. Departs from "Murano Faro"
- **Route 7:** seasonal (Spring to early Autumn). This is an express line from Murano and the St.Mark's Square and viceversa
- **Route 18:** operates in summer to connect Murano and the Lido Island
- **Alilaguna Blu:** to / from Marco Polo Airport at economical fares and in only 30 minutes

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TICKETS AND FARES

ACTV Tickets

Single ticket costs €9.5 PP, whether for one stop or for a whole tour of the city.

If you plan to use the water buses several times during your stay, consider the purchase of the “**Time Limited Ticket**” which offers better value than the single ticket: allowing you to hop on and off any ACTV vaporetto during the period of its validity, you can maximize your savings.

The validity starts from the exact moment the card is first validated. Remember to always validate your ticket before boarding the vaporetto, and if the machine does not work, make sure to notify the captain. The costs per person are the following: €25 (24h), €35 (48h), €45 (72h) and €65 (weekly pass). They may not seem inexpensive, but considering you have unlimited use of the transport system, they are well worth it!”. Check out [this page](#).

When buying the “Time Limited Ticket”, you will receive an e-voucher which has to be exchanged for physical ticket. You will be asked to exchange it at the first ticket office / ticket machine you find. The sooner the better. However, if you find yourself unable to exchange the voucher for a ticket (e.g. late at night, on non-working days, or at minor water bus stops), keep the e-voucher with you and exchange it as soon as possible the following day or at a different stop.

TIP: a three-day youth card for people between 6 and 29 years old is available and costs €27 instead of €45. Learn more [here](#).

ALILAGUNA Tickets

Normally, tickets in the airport can be purchased at the the Alilaguna booth or by using the ticket machines. On Murano Island, refer to the ticket office located at Colonna stop. Tickets can also be purchased directly on board, but make sure that you have cash. Credit cards are not accepted on the boat! Avoid buying tickets online: unless you are able to exchange the e-voucher at the ticket office prior to boarding, you will be asked to buy tickets again once on board! 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TIP: CHEBATEO? APP



CheBateo? (literally “Which Boat” in the Venetian dialect) is an app developed by a young Venetian guy who wanted to make the life of Venice’s inhabitants easier! Showing the vaporetto routes and schedules, the app can turn itself into your best travel companion while exploring Venice and its lagoon.

Simply select the desired departure and arrival stops, and the app will show you the vaporetto routes available. Note that for some destinations there are multiple routes that could bring you there. For example, since line 4 is a circular path around Venice, you could travel in a clockwise direction on line 4.2 or a counterclockwise direction on line 4.1 to ultimately end up at the same destination. The app makes it simple to understand which line is quickest for you. It also helps to check the app since depending on the area where you are, the journey on a water bus, which travels clockwise instead of counterclockwise, could take you twice as long!
