Boasting 33 floors, it offers 546 rooms and suites, a gym, indoor pool, spa and sauna and an award-winning restaurant. The hotel is conveniently located near the city's high-end fashion boutiques, great dining options, and is within walking distance to many of Melbourne's premier tourist spots, including sporting venues, theatre districts, and corporate offices.

The closest water body is the Yarra River. It flows 242 kilometres west from its source on Mt Baw Baw, through the Yarra Valley which opens out into plains as it winds its way through Great Melbourne, before reaching Port Phillip Bay.
