Khun Nana and I have been to numerous four or five-star hotel ballrooms almost all across Bangkok, but when we finally came to Hyatt Regency Bangkok Sukhumvit, both of us had a mutual feeling that this place was undoubtedly unique. First and foremost, the venue was completely brand-new and therefore everything appeared to be absolutely novel. The ballroom was elegant and modern. The food also fit my expectation. I am quite a meticulous person when it comes to food and this place did not worry me at all as the food was excellent. The hotel's location was suitable and convenient as well, considering that I got married on Thursday, surely traffic congestion was inevitable, and therefore I wished to offer our dear guests various travelling options. Since the hotel is located next to BTS Nana, the traveling was considerably livable.

Furthermore, the hotel staffs were quite lovely and accommodating. Khun Nok, Khun Dan, and Khun Miew were exceptionally professional, eloquent, and without any irritating hard sell. Talking to them was always smooth and pleasant. Particularly, what I admired most was the guest management of the hotel itself. Forasmuch I and Khun Nana have plenty of acquaintances; we were somewhat worried about

the ballroom's capacity that it will not be sufficient for a huge number of guests. However, after we attended Spectrum Lounge & Bar's grand opening ceremony organized by the hotel and watched how the staff managed to handle such problematic situation in an unquestionably excellent manner; we felt that there will definitely not be any guest-related problems if we held the wedding ceremony in this hotel. Eventually, we decided to get married here.

I arranged the ceremony to be an engagement ceremony in the morning and a banquet in the evening, in which the venue was minimally decorated in the morning. Only the stage was set, a few chairs were set up for the guests, and not so many flower decors. There were several formalities during this session. Commencing with food offering to nineteen monks in the front of the hotel and followed by Khan Maak procession. The ceremony was just like any other normal ceremonies after we escorted Khun Nana to the ceremony spot. We began with exchanging rings, paying respect to the elders, and finished with water pouring session. I was tremendously delighted during the water pouring and token accepting session due to the fact that the holy water was honourably bestowed on us by His

Holiness the Supreme Patriarch himself, which was brought to mix with the blessed water and used afterwards. I felt that it was truly auspicious for the beginning of our marriage and beloved guests who attended the ceremony.

As for the evening ceremony's decoration, we were partially inspired by the decoration idea from a wedding fair 'SabuyWedding Festival 2019' by combining our personal tastes and styles.

Khun Nana and I have predilection for seas and oceans. The place of our marriage proposal was on the beach next to The Golden Gate Bridge during sunset and we held our pre-wedding photoshoot on Phuket beaches. Hence, we utilized sunset in the ocean's colours in a pastel mood to decorate the ceremony. For instances: sky blue, navy blue, champagne gold and silver.



Moreover, as we both wanted a ceremony with slight sobriety and not too much sweetness, we did not use varied flowers. We only used a few roses with not so many colours to mix with wild grass and Monstera, Khun Nana's favourite flower. The inside and the front of the ballroom are identically furnished.

Our evening ceremony was simple and meaningful. After the bride and the groom walked through the ballroom door to the stage, the master of ceremonies had summoned the person presiding over the ceremony to bless the wedding couple without the garlands, and then we expressed our gratitude to him and other distinguished guests. The evening session completed with a cake cutting ceremony and bouquet tossing.



After the ceremony seamlessly ended, I realized that I made the right decision choosing this amazing wedding venue. The hotel's service was apparently great and their staffs were attentive and performed everything perfectly. For 800 guests that attended my wedding ceremony, way more than I initially anticipated, almost overflowed the ballroom but still praises were heard throughout the ceremony specifically the staffs that were polite, lovely, experienced, and made no mistakes.
